PASTOR SCOT'S PONDERINGS... THE PARABLE OF THE 3 SISTERS

This summer I embarked on a great adventure: raising chickens for eggs. What do I know about raising chickens? Nothing. But I didn't let that little fact stop me. I got online and researched breeds, coop designs, dos and don'ts, and the local ordinances. When I felt I knew enough, I built my coop, bought the supplies, and with the blessing of my very indulgent wife, I went and picked up The 3 Sisters. (They are Barred Rocks, if you care to know.)



The very first thing I did with The 3 Sisters was to keep them in their coop for 4 days. This was so they would learn that this was their place. The place where they would sleep, find food, and most importantly be safe. I think that knowing they had a safe place to return gave them the courage to go out into the world. The Hawk Scare of 2016 put their safe place to the test immediately. When they could trust that it really was a safe place, they were able to discover the joys the world brings too. The joy of bugs, weeds, and cracked corn.

Obviously, I couldn't help but see how this story of The 3 Sisters applies to communities of faith. Communities of faith are places where we are fed with the food that gives us life. They are places where we find a place to belong. They are the places that are a harbor against the storms of life. They are the places that give us the courage to go out into the big wide world with all its dangers, joys and adventures.

September is always an exciting time at Mount Olive because people are back from vacation, we're back to three worships, Sunday School and AoB start up again, Adult Education kicks into high gear, and the various small groups start meeting again. LOOKING FORWARD TO 2016-2017...

Mount Olive looks forward to another exciting year of equipping all ages on our faith journeys. Come along and see!

- **Sunday School 2016** is offered for three-year olds through 5th grade and adults during the education hour of 9:15-10:15 a.m. In 2016, SS for the PK to 5th grade set will kick off on **Rally Day, September 11th, at 9:30 a.m.**, with an opening in the Sanctuary. Families are invited to come along to register their children in the main entryway and then join in with singing and prayer for our Sunday School year. Our outdoor worship will begin at 10 a.m. on that day.
 - **September 25th** – Presentation of Beginner's bibles at 9:15 a.m.
 - **September 25th – 9:15-10:15 a.m.** – “The Bible & Me” class with Bible presentation on **October 2nd** at 9:15 a.m.

We have opportunities for teachers in our **Pre-Kindergarten classes** this year and are looking for two or three leaders who would be willing to rotate their teaching Sundays. Please contact Nicole Hunkel or Cindy Dobberke to learn more.

- **AoB 2016** (formerly known as confirmation) is typically for 6th-8th grade students. Our Affirmation of Baptism (AoB) is a three-year opportunity for students to explore their faith using teaching, discussions, and experiences involving the Bible, Martin Luther's Small Catechism, and faith in daily life. Letters detailing more information about AoB will be sent to 6th-8th grade families inviting participation in AoB during the month of August. In 2016, AoB will formally begin on **September 20th**, with a 6 p.m. meal together with families. If you have questions now or would like to participate as a small group guide, please contact Pastor Scot or Cindy Dobberke.
- **Adult Education:** We will meet on Sunday mornings at 9:15 a.m. in the Library. See more details on page 6.
- **Gather:** Our Gather study group will meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 9:30 a.m. In September we will meet at Mount Olive. Please contact Cindy Dobberke or Betty Hinkelman for further information.

- **Crossways:** The Mount Olive Wednesday evening Bible study resumes on **Wednesday, September 14th**. We will meet every Wednesday for 9 weeks, from 9/14 through 11/9, to study a Crossways short course about the parables of Jesus in Luke's gospel. We will meet at 6:30 p.m., and finish no later than 8 p.m. We will be using a syllabus developed by Pastor Harry Wendt, the creator of Crossways. The cost of the syllabus is \$11. OUR GOAL is to raise \$5,000 for ELCA World Hunger-supported water projects in the U.S. and around the world.

For Walk for Water Sunday, on September 18th, we are excited to have Mikka McCracken proclaim the gospel among us. Mikka lives in Chicago and serves with ELCA World Hunger as Director for Planning and Engagement. A South Korean adoptee, she grew up in northern Minnesota and is a life-long Lutheran. Mikka graduated in political science and peace studies from Gustavus Adolphus College and completed her certificate in nonprofit management from the University of Illinois at Chicago School of Continuing Studies. She believes it is possible to end poverty and hunger, and that the church has an important role to play so that all are fed.



In her seven years at the ELCA churchwide offices, Mikka has also worked with the ELCA Justice for Women program and ELCA Washington Office on gender justice advocacy and ELCA Global Mission on "glocal" learning events. She currently serves on the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) international council as one of five members from the North American region and the Vorstand (board) of the ELCA Wittenberg Center in Germany and the statewide advisory board of Lutheran Advocacy- Illinois.

Mikka enjoys recreational running, original movie music scores, the great outdoors and good vegetarian food.

Because Jesus speaks many parables in Luke, this Gospel also becomes a source for deep reflection about the nature of God's reign and the ways of living faithfully in this world.

May we again be surprised and changed by God’s Word for the world.

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study –

In an informal setting, adults explore various books of the Bible and how they address the religious, moral, ethical, and social issues faced by Lutheran Christians today. Discussion/class topics are publicized in the weekly church bulletins and monthly newsletters.



Discussions begin on **Sunday, September 18th**, at **9:15 a.m.** in the Library. We start the educational season with the **New Testament book of Luke**, which is also this year’s lectionary Gospel.
