FALL STEWARDSHIP 2022

As an update to my stewardship article in the November newsletter, by the time this December newsletter "goes to press", the 2023 pledge forms will be in the mail to all members. We encourage members to return their pledge forms by *Sunday, December 18, 2022.* You can

return the pledge form in the mail using the envelope that is enclosed with the pledge form materials. Alternatively, you can also return your pledge form in the offering basket during the offering at any Sunday worship.

This is the time of year when I am called upon to provide forecasts to the council summarizing or congregation's expected financial position at the end of the calendar year. This year has certainly been a challenge with the impact of a pastoral retirement and lower attendance post-pandemic. Our finances have been impacted by the vacancy in the pastoral position (savings) and lower nonpledge income due to lower attendance. Through it all, thanks in large part to the faithful and consistent stewardship of our congregation, I am expecting that congregational income will cover expenses for 2022. Much like last year, through October 2022, members who pledged to the ministry as a group are ahead of their pledge commitment! I thank all those who have pledged to our ministry and greatly appreciate our members' keeping current on those pledges.

The importance of our pledge support has never been more evident than in this environment of constant change. We have a significant number of families that pledge to our ministry each year, and in 2022, those pledges support nearly 70% of our annual budget. With a significant amount of our annual spending supported by pledges, we are blessed with the ability to plan our ministry much more effectively as well as endure the financial impact of fluctuations in attendance.

As in the past, Fall is the time we ask our membership to prayerfully consider making a pledge toward the ministry for the next year. This is a time when we lift up the importance of good stewardship, sharing the gifts God has blessed us with, and the importance of consistently supporting the ministries at Mount Olive. Since we want to reach all our membership with our stewardship appeal, we will be conducting the stewardship activities with a combination of in-worship activities as well as mail and e-mail. As mentioned above, the stewardship materials should be in the mail by the time you read this. We will also have pledge forms available at worship services during our pledge drive which can be returned with your weekly offering.

If you have pledged in the past, please consider continuing that discipline with a pledge for our 2023 ministry and consider increasing your pledge in response to God's blessings to you. If you have not pledged in the past, please consider this act of faith for 2023. Again, thank you for your faithful stewardship, and for considering a pledge to our 2023 ministry.

Who is Camp Kindred: (Camp) Project Kindred is a youth development program dedicated to disrupting the cycle of segregation by uniting and empowering diverse young leaders through transformative experiences. The camp provides countless opportunities to unite Milwaukee's young people and lead them to common ground, foster positive peer relationships, and develop the skills and values necessary to become empowered future leaders — building diverse, equitable, loving communities for the next generation.



How does Camp Kindred Help? Project Kindred is an eight-year experimental leadership program that develops diverse communities of empowered young leaders in communities divided by segregation. Their goal is to equip young people with the skills, values, and relationships needed to build a more equitable and loving Milwaukee. The program begins in 5th grade through 12th grade where participants will form a team with diverse peers and role models that they will work with throughout their journey, creating incredibly deep bonds that will last a lifetime.
