MOUNT OLIVE ACTS TEAM UPDATE

The Mount Olive ACTS team recently disbursed gifts to help grow God's ministry to several partners. Each month we will highlight a recipient in order to bring awareness to how the memorial from Dorothy Gollmar's estate is being used to spread God's love.



Who are Life Navigators: Located in Wauwatosa, WI, Life Navigators was founded in 1949 by parents who sought to provide opportunities, disability resources, and services for their children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Their early efforts resulted in mandated special education services, day programming, community-based recreation, and residential and employment programming. Life Navigators has provided corporate guardianship services since 1977. The program expanded in 2021 to serve 70 individuals with the plan to expand services to an additional 50 people next year.



How do Life Navigators Help? When a person turns 18 years old, he or she is an adult and is presumed to be able to exercise his or her legal rights. Some individuals, however, need additional support to make informed decisions about their lives. They need to go through a legal process in which a person or corporation is appointed as their guardian. Guardianship for individuals should be evaluated on an individual basis. Not every person with a disability needs a guardian. For those that do meet the criteria under WI State Statue Chapter 54, a guardian is necessary for decision-making, monitoring, advocacy, and support. The Guardianship assures that the

personal, civil, and human rights of each individual are being served and protected. It encourages each induvial to participate to the maximum extent of their abilities in decisions; plus, inspires each individual to act on their own behalf in



matters in which they are able to do so.

How can MTO help? Beyond financial donations, Life Navigators welcomes volunteers on game nights and specific outings. Even supporting the promotion of these events through marketing support or fundraising events is encouraged. A donation of toiletries, winter wear, blankets, and care packages are certainly needed at this time. For more details contact information@lifenavigators.org

EPIPHANY

The 12 days or season of Christmas ends on January 6th,

with Epiphany. Epiphany is the day we celebrate the arrival of the Magi, those wise people from the East who followed a star to find Jesus in Bethlehem. The season of Epiphany continues through Shrove Tuesday, the



day before Ash Wednesday, aka Fat Tuesday or Mardi Gras. In 2023, this falls on February 21st.

On *Sunday, January 8th*, Mount Olive will observe the beginning of the Epiphany season by Blessing the church building and the availability of Epiphany resources, *INCLUDING YOUR EPIPHANY STAR WORD** for the year 2023 and your own Epiphany Home Blessing kit for your use at home during the season of Epiphany! Be sure to pick them up and celebrate the wonderful light that Jesus has brought to our world.

* The use of star words, also called "star gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany. The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are written or printed on paper stars. These paper stars are then arranged face down in a basket, which is passed during worship for participants to randomly draw out a star word. Participants are encouraged to trust the word they have drawn, and not to replace the word. Individuals are often encouraged to place their star word somewhere they will see it regularly throughout the year to allow consistent reflection on how God has moved through, around, or in connection to that word.



Mount Olive's Faithful Innovation team (Betty Arntson, Betty Hinkelman, Conrad Dierks, Cindy Dobberke, coach Lynda VanDien, and Pastor Sandy) met in the month of December and shared discoveries/questions that have arisen with the Dwelling in the Word scripture we are using: Acts 16:6-15. We also reviewed our first (maybe not so official experiment), the Advent Path, where community members were invited to share what gives them hope in the world.

We continue to work on our active listening skills, with a goal of having conversations with our congregation and the greater community about where they see God active in their lives.

We will meet with our larger Greater Milwaukee Synod cohort on January 21st. Please contact any of us with questions and we ask you to continue to keep the Faithful Innovation team in your prayers!
