A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SANDY

In the **heart** of summer, I extend a **hearty** message of thanksgiving to leaders of the Mission Exploration (MET) Team including Karen Sperstad (Chair), Brooke Adcock, Kiana Adcock, Cindy Dobberke, Bruce Gunderson, Glenna Gunderson, Eva Schindhelm, and Duane Thornton. They have completed the Mission Site Profile (MSP) and a two-page summary which will be shared with the congregation. Their ministry in Mount Olive's transition process is now complete.

In coordination with Greater Milwaukee Synod staff, we look forward to **one joint worship service on July 16th at 9 a.m., followed by a Town Hall Meeting at 10 a.m.** in the sanctuary, followed by fellowship and snacks. We welcome Bishop Paul Erickson and Pastor Kristin Nielsen, Assistant to the Bishop for Congregations in Mission (who will be working with the leaders of Mount Olive during the call process) to present the completed Mission Site Profile (MSP). We will also introduce leaders of the Call Team who were each elected by the Church Council. This team begins their work soon and is responsible for receiving names of pastoral candidates, determining the candidate visit and interview process, conducting interviews and bringing a candidate to the congregation.

As we continue to reflect on the Gospel of Matthew, we encounter Jesus using seed and yeast imagery to describe the unexpected, exponential growth of God's kingdom. The mustard seed grows into a shrub that provides safety for birds, and the yeast allows flour to expand into bread that can feed many. What wonderful images for the ministry that we share at Mount Olive! God's provision abounds in creation and community, and in the ordinary things and holy things around us. And it all suggests that "the kingdom of God is near," good news not only for the future, but also for today, as "hope" revealed through Jesus.

Please pray for the Call Team and their important ministry in the days and months ahead. May the Holy Spirit lead, guide, and lift up the candidate that the people of Mount Olive seek as your pastor.

Faithful Innovations Update:

One of the practices we've explored in the Synod's Faithful Innovations learning community is use of three basic tools for the creation of a feedback loop for further faithful innovations. The tools are:

LISTEN – ACT - SHARE

For example, over the past months, the FI Team has spent

time in **LISTEN** mode. We've heard from conversations within and outside of Mount Olive that people are looking for places to connect.

Following prayer discernment and amongst the team. we moved into ACT mode to create space for connection on the Mount Olive greenspace. We placed a trio of



chairs in the yard and would like to invite anyone to use them as a place to connect with friends or friends you've yet to meet through conversation. You name it! *The chairs are there for your use, someone walking by, for the use of our neighbors and visitors to Mukwonago, whatever!*

Next, we move into **SHARE** mode. The Faithful Innovation Team will have our own experiences when making use of the chairs, and we'd love to hear back from you who have used them or who have thought about how you might use the chairs. If you have used them, please share some feedback with us on your experience. As we listen to each other, perhaps the feedback might spur us onto another faithful innovations action!

COUNCIL CORNER

First, I would like to start with a reminder of the status of our Pastoral Call process:

June 20, 2023: The



Council reviewed and voted on the Mission Site Profile submitted by the Mission Exploration Team. The Mission Site Profile is the report the synod will use to match us with pastoral candidates.

- June 20, 2023: The Council also voted on the slate of members to serve as the Call Committee.
- July 16, 2023: Town Hall Meeting. We will have one worship service at 9 a.m. with Bishop Paul Erickson and Pastor Kristin Nielsen. After service, we will have our Town Hall Meeting where the congregation will review the Mission Site Profile, learn more about the Call Process, and be given the opportunity to ask questions about the process and "where we go from here."

The Mission Site Profile serves several purposes. Primarily, it is a profile of who we are as a congregation. The synod staff will use it to determine which pastoral candidates have the potential to be the best fit for Mount Olive. Secondly, it is our "resume" that pastoral candidates will use to learn about our ministry. As with any recruitment process, the Pastoral candidates will be assessing whether Mount Olive is a good fit for them, much like the Call Committee will be assessing candidates for the best fit for our congregation.

One observation that I drew from reading Mount Olive's draft Mission Site Profile is the extent that the report draws attention to the volunteers and lay leaders in the congregation. The focus on our level of member engagement in worship and ministry activities illustrates the fact that the Pastor alone isn't the ministry, but serves as leader to assist and guide the congregation in achieving our ministry goals. Likewise, pastoral candidates will look for congregations with a vibrant group of leaders and volunteers.

I believe that Mount Olive is blessed with worship volunteers, education volunteers and strong leadership that should be a welcome asset for any pastoral candidate. However, I would like to take this opportunity to reach out and ask that if you have been hesitant or uncomfortable getting more involved in our worship and ministry activities, please consider volunteering your gifts of time and talent to our ministry. Whether it is reading at worship, ushering, participation on council, assisting with worship, Christian education activities or committee work, I think you will find that volunteering and sharing your gifts will foster a sense ownership in our ministry and provide another avenue for you to live out your faith.

We ask that you keep us in your prayers, and we look forward to sharing our story with you in August!


