Our fall schedule is in full swing including worship, Faith Explorers of all ages, Bible studies, and Green Space activities. We are grateful for Mt. Bring your furry or feathered friends for a blessing and celebrate their role in God's good creation. We celebrate Reformation Sunday on October 29th and will participate in the Rite of Confirmation at the 10 a.m. service as young adults make public affirmation of their baptisms. On Sunday, November 5th, at 11 a.m., join us for lunch, All Saints activities and Mt. Olive pumpkin bowling.

We continue to pray for the ministry of the Call Committee including Betty Arntson (Chair), Nicole Carpenter (Secretary), Kiana Adcock, Bruce Gunderson, Dennis Martin, Eva Schindhelm, and Tim Sperstad. We trust the Holy Spirit to lead and guide their discernment as they identify a pastoral candidate for Mt. Olive.

The Equipping the Saints campaign expresses our confidence that God is at work in the 119 congregations of the Greater Milwaukee Synod with a goal of \$2.3 million over three years. \$1,500 per year for three years has been committed by Mt. Olive ACTS fund. Mt. Olive's goal is to raise \$1,500 of matching funds per year for three consecutive years for a total of \$9,000. Funds from the campaign will be directed to areas of Innovation, Collaboration, and Leadership. The innovation campaign will support grants to congregations, strengthen the ministry of Outreach for Hope, invest in racial equity, campus ministry, rostered ministers, and support partner ministries. We conclude the campaign on Sunday, October 22nd, when Pastor Matt Short, Assistant to the Bishop for Evangelical Mission will be our preacher. Please prayerfully consider participating.

Through the power of the Spirit, God has knit the disciples of Mt. Olive into the one body in Jesus Christ. We pray for continued courage, patience, and vision to strengthen our vocation of witness to the world and service to others.

At our class reunion, I listened

intently as my friend, Ron, talked of his "new work." Since retiring he has been doing missionary work in Brazil. He usually goes for a month, three times a year. Ron graduated from MSOE and as an engineer he travels with a group of dentists. They take their equipment, supplies, and tents in large canoes and head up the Amazon River. When they dock and start to unload, people come from far and wide for treatment. Ron said they set up out in the middle of nowhere and people come out of the forests. I marveled at the smile in his voice as he told us of his work as a volunteer.

Of course, not all of us can be like Ron and serve in a foreign country, but that might be the inspiration we need to serve in our church and our community.

Personally, I come from a family of nine firefighters, five of them volunteers on the East Troy Fire Department with 188 years of combined volunteer service. So, I have long wondered what inspires someone to be a volunteer. To work all those hours and years for nothing in return but an occasional thank you and peace in your heart knowing you are helping others. **<u>Council Corner Continued:</u>** Does it take a special gift to be a volunteer? It is difficult for any of us to see our own gifts but a friend or family member may say "oh you have a gift for that!" Sometimes we think of gifts we outwardly see; being athletically gifted or musically gifted. Then there are the hidden gifts: the gift of being a great listener, the gift of leading prayer, and the gift of motivating others to greatness.

I am always in awe of volunteers at Mount Olive who are assistant ministers, worship leaders, readers, singers, musicians, teachers, and our ever faithful "bean counter." CALL COMMITTEE PROCESS AND STATUS REPORT

Now that the Mission Exploration Team ("MET") has completed our Ministry Site Profile, the process of calling a pastor moves to the Call Committee.

The Call Committee has met with our synod mentor for orientation and guidance on the process to be followed. In addition, the Call Committee meets weekly, with tasks assigned each week, to keep the process moving forward.

A very high-level outline of the process as follows:

PREPARATION:

- Detail review of the Ministry Site Profile.
- Preparation for initial interviews, including development of initial interview questions.
- Participation in a mock interview with a local clergy to "field test" the interview questions and process.
- Synod provides candidates' names and profiles for review.

CONSIDERING CANDIDATES:

- Conduct initial interviews (often via teleconference).
- Assessment of candidates and determination of those to be invited for a second interview.

SECOND INTERVIEWS:

- Preparation of second interview questions, tailored from results of initial interview and the candidate's profile.
- Conduct second Interviews. These are held locally and in person and may include a tour of the church and the local area.

FINAL CANDIDATE:

- Determination of a candidate to recommend to council and the congregation. Recommendations must be unanimous within the Call Committee.
- Notify Synod representative of preferred candidate.
- Synod verifies if the chosen candidate is interested in a call to Mount Olive.
- Check references, background check.
- Present recommendation to council.

• Special congregation meeting to propose candidate.

The above is a high-level outline intended to provide you with a general idea of the process. There are multiple tasks within each of the steps above. After the congregational meeting, the Council will then prepare an offer for the final candidate.

One significant component of the process is confidentiality. Most pastoral candidates are currently employed, so the Call Committee is required to maintain confidentiality of candidate information until the interview process is complete, the synod has been notified, and the candidate has confirmed interest in the call to Mount Olive.

Currently the Call Committee is working on the development of the initial interview document and laying the groundwork for the tasks within the above outline.

- During this soft opening of worship, the children will have time to check in with each other, engage in music (including birthday celebrations), hear a message geared towards them regarding their Faith Exploration: Sunday School session for the day, and pray together.
- The children will then return to sit with their families for the gathering song, the call to worship, the order of confession and forgiveness, the opening song and prayer.
- As the congregation is seated for the reading of scripture, the children will be invited to head to the lower level. There they will hear the scripture in a more age-appropriate fashion, and explore faith with conversation, activities and prayer. The children will be picked up in the lower level once the 10 a.m. worship service is complete.
- Communion: we also learned from the survey that some parents desire that their children participate in Holy Communion. If desired the parents can gather them from the lower level during the song of the day in order to bring them to the communion table. Children who participate in communion will remain with their family for the rest of the worship service.

THE PRAYGROUND IS OPEN!! (or ... the Return of the Pray Ground!) Mount Olive welcomes all ages to worship and the congregation understands that everyone has different needs at different times of our lives. If you

have а little worshiper, are they in need of space to stretch out and move about during worship? The Pray Ground is ready for The Pray them! Ground is located in the Mount Olive Narthex. Feel free to



use this space as you see fit during worship or outside of worship times.

What is a Pray Ground?

A *Pray Ground* is a place in the front of the sanctuary where worshipers (most often children) can experience worship through age-appropriate worship materials and tools that will help keep them engaged in worship.

Who may use the Pray Ground?

Young children who are not comfortable sitting in a pew or leaving the worship service. Parents, other adults, and older students may choose to sit in a nearby pew, or on the floor with the children.

What about Sunday School?

Mount Olive offers Sunday school for children ages 3 through 5th grade. We begin worship with a soft opening at 9:45, this includes time for the children to meet, sing, pray and hear an age-appropriate message from our leadership team. New this year, the children will sit with their families for the beginning of worship until the lessons are read. At this time, the children may go to the lower level for age-appropriate readings and faith exploration opportunities with our Faith Explorer guides and assistant guides.

Why offer a Pray Ground to families?

We can apply scripture to help us understand why Pray Grounds are valuable for both worship and faith exploration:

- Scripture: Matthew 10:13-15. Unlike his disciples, who considered children a distraction, Jesus welcomed & blessed the children.
- **Tradition**: The tradition of sending children out of worship prevents them from participating in essential components of Christian faith formation, i.e., community prayer, music, scripture reading, pastor's message and Holy Communion.
- **Reason**: In order to be fully formed and developed, worship skills, behaviors, knowledge and beliefs require exposure, practice and experience. Without these, children cannot learn what to do in worship or what worship can do for them.
- **Experience** –We'd love to hear about your experience!

What do people in other churches with Pray Grounds say?

Other churches around the world have discovered that:

- Children are more attentive and active in the service when they are in the front of the church.
- When children who are separated out of the worshiping community get to an age to decide for themselves if they want to be a part of worship, they often decide not to be part of worship because it hasn't been part of their life.
- Offering a Pray Ground is a statement to the entire congregation that we are making physical and spiritual space for families.
- Pray Grounds offer an opportunity for spiritual formation to begin at an early age.
