A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SANDY

The time after Epiphany begins and ends with the divine voice claiming and affirming Jesus as "Beloved." At His baptism the sky parts, the voice calls, and all of creation is welcomed into the wonder of God among us. As the season of Epiphany concludes at the Transfiguration, the drama increases at the mountaintop, as God's voice calls us to "listen to Him!"

"Epiphany" which comes from the Greek word "epiphaneia" means "appearance" or "manifestation." In Christian tradition, Epiphany commemorates the first manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, in other words, making Jesus "known" to the world.

As we enter this New Year, this continues to be our mission: making Jesus known to the world. It is the mission of Mt. Olive and of every Christian church. Epiphany speaks of Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist and our own identity as children of God. Epiphany reminds us that we, too, are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. Epiphany reveals the light that shines in the darkness of this world and the life that we are called to live as Jesus' followers. As days once more grow longer, even creation acknowledges God's creative power to show us that "Christ is the life" to redeem the world.

It has been a privilege and a pleasure to serve the people of Mt. Olive as your interim pastor just a bit over one year. What a blessing to accompany you through the Mission Exploration process, to get to know so many of you, and to partner with you in worship, Bible study, faith formation for youth and adults, and pastoral care visits.

I will be concluding my interim pastor role at Mt. Olive on January 21, 2024, so that I can transition to my next interim pastor role at Vernon Lutheran Church, Mukwonago. You have been an immense blessing to me in this season in which we have served together.

I trust that you are, indeed, rooted in God's grace as the power of the Holy Spirit leads and guides you to call your next pastor. THE ADVENT PATH

What a beautiful Saturday evening we had for our "second annual" Advent Path during Midnight Magic. We were blessed with decent weather and it was an atmosphere of joy that I saw from my post by the door of the barn that night.

The Advent Path, open and running, followed the parade where we saw many smiling faces and heard many sounds as it passed by. There was so much celebration ushering in the season of Christmas including a few fireworks as the parade began! I couldn't help but notice the contrast after that as I took my seat by the barn where the baby Jesus lay in a manger flagged with the tiny "star" lights on either side. It was a peaceful and joyful picture.

From my vantage point I could see the whole path laid out with lights and each stop along the way equipped with an appropriate Bible passage and message to be read by those walking the path depicting Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, the four candles of Advent, and then a fifth stop where I sat with the "baby." What a privilege to watch the "travelers" as they walked and stopped at each post, read the posted scripture and message, and took part in the activity provided there.

My post was equipped as well with a final activity to partake for the "travelers>" It was this:

"in a word, what does this season of Advent and the coming of Jesus into the world mean to you?"

I watched as each person took time to consider just what that one word would be for them. Many commented that it was hard to narrow down their thoughts to one word! And so --- thoughtfully a word, or in some cases more than one word, was written on the stars provided and pinned on the boards with the tiny star-like lights.

I am thankful to have been there and to have experienced that quiet joy in each participant on our Advent path, to have heard as the scripture and message at each post was read out loud, and to have been able to partake of that experience of quiet joy that I felt as I watched and listened that evening. It was a beautiful night and a beautiful beginning of this Advent season where people could find warmth by the fire, and hot chocolate, and experience the warmth of the Joy in our hearts at His coming.

COUNCIL CORNER

This month showcasing...

There is certainly a lot of activity at Mount Olive these days. We just recently participated in Mukwonago's "Midnight Magic". In addition to hosting several MHS high school musical groups and the Grace Notes Jazz Ensemble, we also hosted an Advent Path and bonfire, which were well-attended. Sunday December 17 was the Sunday School Christmas Program. It was a fun event for the participants and the congregation. There are also a number of fellowship, prayer and bible study opportunities offered every week. I direct you to the calendar in this newsletter and encourage you to participate in some of the many offerings we are blessed to have at Mount Olive.

I am going to take this opportunity to highlight two efforts currently in-process:

Call Committee:

The Call Committee interviewed three candidates in October, and none of those interviews resulted in second interviews. We are currently waiting for the Synod to present additional candidates for initial interviews. We realize this process is taking time and are anxious to continue to move forward in our candidate search. As a person who has been both a hiring manager and a job candidate not all that long ago, I can attest that the holiday season is very slow for hiring organizations and for candidates. We are hopeful and optimistic that both candidate and interview activity will pick up again in early January. In the interim, the Call Committee continues to meet to further refine our interview questions and process, review our options with our Synod advisor, and simply to keep the momentum going as a team.

<u>Stewardship – Pledges for 2024:</u>

This is the time of year that we encourage our congregation members to consider pledging toward the next year ministry. We have been blessed that about 70% of our annual budget has been supported through member pledges. We sent a letter with a pledge form and return envelope to all members in late November.

- If you have not pledged in the past, please prayerfully consider starting that faith discipline with a pledge to the 2024 ministry.

- We would like the pledge forms returned by December 24th.

We continue to collect used **Eyeglasses** and sunglasses for the Lions Club Recycle for Sight program. Used prescription glasses and lenses, sunglasses (nonprescription only), children's glasses and lenses and reading glasses are welcome.

Projects We are also collecting used <u>Hearing</u> **Aids** for the Wisconsin Lions Foundation's Hearing Aid Project. This program provides hearing aids free of charge to Wisconsin residents who qualify. The hearing aids are funded by collecting used hearing aids and recycling them for credit. They may be placed in the same bucket as the eyeglasses.

The Lions also recycle used <u>Cell Phones</u> so they may also be deposited in the Eyeglasses bucket.

The collection bucket will remain in the Narthex all year round so bring in your items any time.

Looking Ahead to January and February: We will be collecting gently used clean coats to distribute to local shelters. Coats may be men's, women's or children's.

CALL COMMITTEE PROCESS AND STATUS REPORT

The Call Committee interviewed three candidates in October, but sadly none were the right fit for Mount Olive. We are currently waiting for new candidate names from the synod office. Candidates are screened by the synod and provided in pools of about three as needed. Please read the information below re-printed from previous newsletters if you are interested in all the details of the Call Committee. Also please feel free to reach out to Call Committee Team members if you have any questions or concerns. We need and truly appreciate everyone's continued prayers.

The Call Committee has met with our synod mentor for orientation and guidance on the process to be followed. In addition, the Call Committee meets weekly, with tasks assigned each week, to keep the process moving forward.

A very high-level outline of the process as follows:

PREPARATION:

- Detail review of the Ministry Site Profile.
- Preparation for initial interviews, including development of initial interview questions.
- Participation in a mock interview with a local clergy to "field test" the interview questions and process.
- Synod provides candidates' names and profiles for review.

CONSIDERING CANDIDATES:

- Conduct initial interviews (often via teleconference).
- Assessment of candidates and determination of those to be invited for a second interview.

SECOND INTERVIEWS:

- Preparation of second interview questions, tailored from results of initial interview and the candidate's profile.
- Conduct second Interviews. These are held locally and in person and may include a tour of the church and the local area.

FINAL CANDIDATE:

• Determination of a candidate to recommend to council and the congregation. Recommendations must be unanimous within the Call Committee.

- Notify Synod representative of preferred candidate.
- Synod verifies if the chosen candidate is interested in a call to Mount Olive.
- Check references, background check.
- Present recommendation to council.
- Special congregation meeting to propose candidate.

The above is a high-level outline intended to provide you with a general idea of the process. There are multiple tasks within each of the steps above. After the congregational meeting, the Council will then prepare an offer for the final candidate.

One significant component of the process is confidentiality. Most pastoral candidates are currently employed, so the Call Committee is required to maintain confidentiality of candidate information until the interview process is complete, the synod has been notified, and the candidate has confirmed interest in the call to Mount Olive.
