### Notes from the Bishop

As the summer heats up, so does the political rhetoric, especially in this presidential election year. Even as political content seems to overwhelm our social media feeds and dominate the airwaves, we don't always know how to engage in conversations on these matters with folks who may disagree with us, especially if they are our friends, families or members of our congregations. While some may have no desire to participate in potentially divisive conversations, I would hope that, as faithful disciples of the risen Lord, we could find a way to have these hard and holy conversations about topics that are central to the health and future of our democracy.

The question is, how? How do we discuss these hot topics without demonizing or dismissing those who disagree with us? As a general guide, I have found that the four core values we have identified as a synod can be helpful tools as we wade into these turbulent waters.

- 1. Curiosity. I have found that it is more helpful to view hard conversations as an opportunity to learn, not to convert the other to your way of thinking. Questions like, "What experience led you to that conclusion?" "How does that perspective connect with your faith?" "What are the core values that guide how you think, act, and vote?" can open the door to more reflective conversations. Too often, we think that we can lob facts back and forth in order to convince someone of the rightness of our perspective. I have found that most of us come to our convictions as a result of our life experiences and the core beliefs that we have long held, and then we look for facts to back up our positions. If we can listen first, seeking to learn and not convince, we can begin to identify some shared beliefs and seek some common ground.
- 2. Courage. I have found that we are often afraid of these emotionally charged conversations, fearful that simply having them will damage our relationships and upset the fragile peace of our family gatherings or our congregational events. There's no denying that doing this well is hard work and carries some risk. I would hope, however, that we can recognize that these are important conversations to have, and the decisions we make in the political arena carry life and death consequences for many. Can we summon the courage we need to ask questions and open a conversation, trusting that the Holy Spirit will guide us?
- 3. Compassion. One of the most distressing components of what passes for political discourse these days is the tendency folks have to diminish the humanity of others. Whether it is those who think and vote differently, or the "enemy" who is trying to take what we have or destroy our way of life, whenever we build walls to separate "us" from "them," we stray from our core Christian belief that each and every person is made in God's image and is a beloved and redeemed sinner, just like we are.

4. Collaboration. If we can find some common ground with our conversation partner and begin to identify some shared values and goals, we might begin to imagine ways that we could work together to achieve those goals. It may well be that

our different perspectives and experiences prevent us from joining forces, but we may be able to recognize that, even though we disagree on the strategies and policies that will move us forward, we share a common commitment to building a stronger and more just world. It may also be that the divisions between us are so sharp and enduring that the best we can hope for is a respectful understanding that, even though we don't and may never agree, we now have a deeper understanding of and appreciation for one another's perspective.

The Apostle Paul invites us to "lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." (Ephesians 4:1-3) I believe this is not a call to seek a shallow sense of peace that overlooks our differences, but a call to engage in respectful, faith-filled conversations about the pressing issues and challenges of this age.
