A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STEVE

"Peace I leave with you, my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." John 14:27 NRSV

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

As we approach Christmas, we can reflect on the lifegiving light that has come near through the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus is the light that shines through the darkness of this world.

When life is filled with anxiety and fear during this time of year, it can help to look to the Christmas story. Bethlehem is a place of mystery and wonder, far removed from the wild world we live in, where angels populate the skies and appear to shepherds in the fields. In this holy scene, we come to know, far from the problems of the world, a mother and father and their firstborn son. Someday, humanity will come to know God's farreaching love for all through this first-born son. Can you feel the stress start to lessen? Familiar as it is, the Christmas story provides a brief escape from the real world we face daily, a world that has difficulty finding time for self or God.

As North Americans, we live at a certain speed. Yet, when we do not find time to unwind or disconnect, we can begin to feel unhappy about our pace. If we take time for Jesus through prayer, worship, and reading scripture, we can find rest from the burdens we face in our lives. Yet, in the midst of this changing world, it is hard to see how taking time for God can give us rest. Come and see how God can provide rest for your soul. When you feel bogged down by life, you are invited to make space for Jesus. If you do, you can find rest for your burdens because you face them with Jesus by your side.

Life is more peaceful when we make room for Jesus in our lives, especially during the craziest times of this holiday season, which is good news on this day.


TIME WITH THE PASTOR

Dear Member of Mount Olive Lutheran:

By the time this newsletter is issued, you will have already received the pledge materials for the Fall 2024 Stewardship campaign. Consider this newsletter a gentle reminder to prayerfully consider a pledge toward our 2025 ministry.

Each year in the fall, we reach out to our congregation and ask for pledges to support the ministry for the next year. Like last year, in order that we may reach as many members as possible, we will conduct our request for pledges to the 2025 ministry with a combination of direct mail and announcements during worship. Our 2024 mailing was sent to all members the week of 11/18/2024, and included a letter of instruction, a pledge form and a self-addressed, stamped

envelope for members to return their pledge form.

We are truly blessed with a congregation of faithful stewards. In the last three years, member pledges have supported nearly 70% of our annual expense budget. The remainder of our income (non-pledge member donations, loose offerings, and special service income) is very dependent on worship attendance. Consequently, the consistent income from our members who pledge is especially vital to supporting our ministry.

If your faith story has led you to making a pledge in the past, please consider continuing your faith journey with a pledge to our 2025 ministry and consider increasing your pledge in response to God's blessings to you. If you have not pledged in the past, please consider this act of faith for 2025.

We encourage members to return their pledge forms any time before Sunday, December 15, 2024. You can return the pledge form in the mail using the enclosed envelope. Alternatively, you can also return your pledge form in the offering basket during the offering at any Sunday worship.

If you participate in the Simply Giving program for your contributions to our ministry, we do count your Simply Giving amount as a pledge. We encourage members who participate in the Simply Giving program to return a pledge card as well, especially if you wish to increase your Simply Giving amount. If you are not using Simply Giving for your contributions to our ministry, I encourage you to consider this method of funding your contributions. It is a convenient way to maintain consistent support of our ministry. Visit the church website (<u>www.mountolive-elca.net</u>) and select the "Giving" option on the "Home" page, then select Mount Olive Ministries and follow the prompts. You can also call the church office if you need assistance or more information regarding Simply Giving.

Advent good gifts tree...ELCA World Hunger Good Gifts Tree is back! Help fight hunger in the US and in the

world by purchasing an **ELCA World Hunger Good Gift** from the tree. Gifts of any shape and size are combined to make a difference in the world. The tree will be available following each worship service through December 24th.

October data from the U.S. Department of Agriculture reveals a marked increase in child food insecurity in the U.S. between 2021 and 2022. Food insecurity affected 3.3 million households with children



at times during 2022, up from 2.3 million in 2021. That's 17 million households that were food insecure at some point last year, **affecting 13 million children**.

Internationally, child malnutrition is alarmingly high. **148 million children experienced stunted growth** and development due to a chronic lack of essential nutrients, and **45 million children suffered from wasting**, the most severe and life-threatening form of malnutrition.

Let's work together until all are fed and all can feed themselves! Please contact Cindy Dobberke for more information on this vital ministry of our church.

TAX PLANNING TIPS

Here are some tax-wise planning tips to support the Mount Olive ministry!

- 1. <u>Donate appreciated assets like stocks or bonds</u>. A gift of appreciated assets avoids capital gains tax while also being eligible for a charitable income tax deduction.
- Traditional IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). The QCD allows a donor age 70 ½ or older to donate up to \$105,000 in 2024 to one or more charities. While withdrawals from traditional IRAs are taxable income, QCDs are tax-free and can satisfy some or all of the annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for those individuals age 73 or older.
- 3. <u>If you itemize deductions, consider a cash gift</u>. A cash or check gift to Mount Olive may be deducted up to 60% of adjusted gross income.

Please note that it is important to complete the gift by **December 31^{st}** for it to count for the current tax year.

GATHER FAITH EXPLORATION GROUP

"In God's Garden: What fig trees teach us about Advent" By Hannah Hawkinson

Tuesday, December 17th, 9:30 a.m. Mount Olive Narthex

This Advent, we'll learn from some surprising teachers: fig trees. Astonishingly vibrant, fig trees have a zest for life. Their roots have even been known to bust through plumbing and climb walls like ivy! Yet fig trees also have a dormant period—a time when they do not grow or bear fruit. But this period of waiting and rest isn't a time of waiting around. It's a time of pruning and fertilizing and watering; a time to prepare for the fruitful season ahead.

As we prepare the way of the Lord in this season, we are in our own dormant period of waiting and anticipation. Still, Jesus calls us to "keep awake" and to prepare ourselves for God's coming.
