### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STEVE

Brothers and sisters in Christ:

Your story about faith is unique and can be shared with others. However, sometimes, it can be challenging to tell our story about faith in a non-threatening way. For this month's newsletter article, I want to explore some non-threatening thoughts about our faith that we can share with others.

### Why is worship meaningful?

Worship is meaningful because it gives us a chance to gather weekly for encouragement and to learn from God's word for our spiritual growth. Our worship not only honors and magnifies God, but worship is also for our enlightenment and strength throughout life. Gathering for worship helps us develop character traits such as forgiveness, compassion, a sense of justice, righteousness, kindness, and a love not bound by conditions. Worship feeds us with God's word. We learn about love for God and our neighbor through God's word.

Worship is essential because it gives us at least a half hour each week to practice living our daily lives, strengthening our faith, and working on our ability to love God by loving our neighbor. Worship is one of the only places in the world where we can find peace, comfort, hope, and love, even when we seem to fall short of being peaceful, comfortable, hopeful, or loving.

### Why is prayer necessary?

Prayer is essential because it is an active conversation that connects us with God. It is the vehicle for daily dialog with the One who creates us. Through prayer, we can share our lives with God, express thanks and praise, ask for forgiveness and healing, and acknowledge God's grace and mercy. Prayer gives us somewhere to go during all times of life, which can provide us with hope and comfort. The vehicle of prayer drives us towards being comforted by the One who has created us, which is good news.

### Why is God necessary?

The God that created the universe and everything in it, including us, makes God important. The Creator wants our needs to be filled and will direct our hearts toward experiences in life that can help fill our needs.

However, sometimes, we think we can only be satisfied when we have everything we want. It is good to know that the Creator of the universe is more concerned

with our needs and fulfilling those spaces so we can have abundant life. God may not be as worried about our will and our wants being filled.


God is essential; God cares about us. However, God is also important because he gives us boundaries for healthy living and a purpose to follow within those boundaries. We seem hard-wired as spiritual beings; we seem most comfortable when God is in our lives through worship, prayer, and daily living. We find importance in a God who arrives in this world to profess love, healing, and eternal life for all who believe. We find importance in living in Christ's example of love and service.

### Your Faith Story Is Important!

It is hoped that this article can spark a conversation about faith or that it could reach the hands of someone trying to find language to explain their faith. Ultimately, I hope that the Holy Spirit will empower the reader in their journey to tell their story about faith to someone else in a non-threatening manner.

## "Moving Through the Season of Epiphany"

I love all of the Christmas preparations, gatherings, and traditions. One of my favorite things is putting up my Christmas tree. I have ornaments from when my children were born, from their days in school, and ornaments from places we have lived and visited. I am sure you all have a favorite ornament. One of my favorites is a small brass bell I bought in San Francisco in 1979.

Ten years ago, during this time of year, my brother Don was very sick. He could no longer speak but could write us notes of what he wanted to say to us or of something he needed. One day, my sister-in-law called and said, "Do you have a bell or something Don could use to call me?" I grabbed my little brass bell and ran down the driveway to their house. It worked perfectly, and Don felt secure being able to call for help.

I still hang that bell on my tree every year. Sometimes, I walk by, shake the bell, and say, "Miss you, Don." Then I shake it again and say, "Teacher says every time a bell rings, an angel gets its wings."

Then comes Epiphany, the day I traditionally take down my tree. It always makes me so sad to do that job, yet Epiphany is a celebration of something joyous and wonderful. Epiphany is celebrated on January 6<sup>th</sup>, and the season of Epiphany runs until the day before Ash Wednesday. Epiphany commemorates the day when the wise men visited Jesus, the Messiah. It took them two years of travel following the shining start to Bethlehem.

Can you imagine the devotion, fortitude, and patience the wise men had to complete such a journey? In today's world, we want instant gratification: slow internet, we get frustrated; slow driver ahead of us, road range starts to set in. Which of us would stay that focused on a single goal? They stayed focused on God's shining star throughout the two-year journey.

As Christians with Jesus in our hearts, how can we be a shining light to others? Do others see the love of God shining out from us? God's guiding light allows us to manifest and visualize our purpose. He guides us along our path to where He wants us to be, even though we may not realize it now.

Though the Christmas season has ended, and we continue our journey in life, let us be patient and focus on our path toward God's shining light.






