A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STEVE

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3:16 (NRSV)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

We are on the edge of beginning the Lenten season. During the season of Lent, we as Christians enter a time of reflection through prayer, repentance of sins, and denial of self in preparation for Easter Sunday. We are waiting on the edge of glory as we wait for God's redemptive action seen through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. During this short season of waiting, we are connected to the other saints of light throughout time and history. For forty days, we wait, looking forward to God being loose through Jesus' passion, resurrection, and ascension to the Father's right hand in glory.

Yet, as we wait for God's unconditional love to come forth in this world, John 3:16 reminds us of good news during this waiting time.

John 3:16, what a fantastic announcement we hear from John's gospel: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not parish but may have eternal life." John's words are genuinely comforting.

One might assume that if God loves anyone, it is those who show love back to God. Yet, that is not what the text reads. It does not say that God so loved the Church, or God so loved the faithful, or that God so loved the pure. No, the focus of John 3:16 seems to go beyond the horizon of one's devotion to religion. John 3:16 is about the deepness and wideness of God's unceasing, compassionate love for all creation.

The message of John 3:16 can provide comfort, hope, and a reason to thank God because it helps us understand God's unconditional love and preference for forgiveness for all people. John 3:16 informs us of a second chance with God through faith, no matter who or what we might be. John 3:16 is beautiful and well-known, and the world is a better place because the Church proclaims its message.

Trusting that anyone, especially God, wants to provide a second chance can be something that can cause the faithful to struggle. Part of the reason is that second chances are not always available to everyone. Giving someone a second chance means we might have to let go

of pain. It is challenging to let go of pain if we cannot forget the trauma we still wrestle with. Sometimes, giving up on people seems easier than providing another opportunity to get hurt. Sometimes, it can be hard to give ourselves a second chance when we make a mistake; we, too, can give up on ourselves.

It would seem that God is telling us to let go of such pain through the message of John 3:16, even though it may be hard to forget. See, John 3:16 is all about letting go of the past and living in a new day saved by grace and love. This is not to say that it is easy or will happen overnight or that we disrespect anyone's feelings. However, if we remember that John 3:16 is about God's never-ending forgiveness, grace, and love, we can find peace and comfort in Jesus' name.

The good news is that even though we may struggle with God's unconditional love or the possibility of a second chance, John 3:16 consistently conveys God's grace. However, if we struggle to believe John's Gospel message embodied in 3:16, all we have to do is read one more verse to hear that God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world but so that the world might be saved through him.

The message embodied in John's Gospel is good news. Jesus' mission has never been about rejection but to rescue and reclaim in the name of the Father. In the end, there is no condemnation in Jesus' name because God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life.

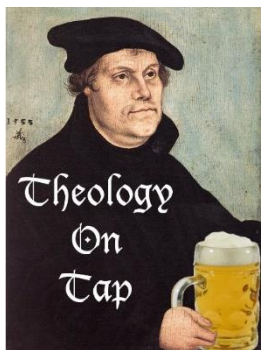

COUNCIL CORNER

A big thank you to all who were able to attend our Annual Meeting on February 2nd. We welcome new Council members Larry Redlin and Scott Shuda; and thank Cheryl Shanovich and Mike Zaddack for re-upping for a second term. The show of support makes me more and more optimistic about our future at Mount Olive. Yes, we have a significant plan for mission deficit, but we are seeing new faces at worship and people returning. We have overcome many hurdles in the past few years, including COVID, the retirement of Pastor Scot, and the elongated MET and Call process, but the Holy Spirit has led us into a bright future.

Three years ago, as I was watching the local news, I saw pictures of a Lutheran church that was closing its doors. Its membership had fallen from cost to 2,000 members to 80 +/- . My shock was that this was my home church, and my parents were founding members. The church was Christ Memorial Lutheran Church and School (MO Synod) located on Thurston Street and Teutonia Avenue on Milwaukee's northside. A combination of demographics, COVID, and an aging congregation led to the closure. Fortunately, a ministry-based group has repurposed the property, and hymns are again being sung within its walls.

I mention this as I ask each of you to pray for guidance and let the Holy Spirit work within you to spread the gospel and invite people to join us on our faith journey. We are fortunate to have been able to call Pastor Steve and I look forward to our continued spiritual and physical growth.

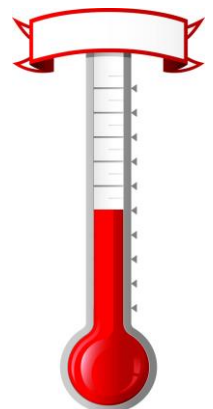

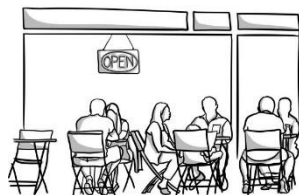
