A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STEVE

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Matthew 11:28-30 NRSV

Dear Mount Olive Family:

It's good news that the calendar tells us we're getting closer to summer. We hope that the calendar will lead us to places where we can find rest in good weather, spend time with friends and family, or relax. However, the calendar might not be the best method to help us lessen the anxiety we feel in our lives. The calendar may not always lead us to life-giving places like Jesus does.

The Gospel message from Matthew at the top of the page serves as a healing balm, meant to bring peace. I believe that God has placed this Gospel in the heart of humanity to provide guiding wisdom as we walk on our pilgrimage in this world.

Dear people, we know that the world can be a cold and harsh place, especially when we are in need. Life confronts us with a variety of trials, challenges, and temptations, and it is those exact trials, challenges, and temptations that may overwhelm our ability to cope with life's stressors on our own.

When I feel overwhelmed, it is comforting to know that God is present. Just so you know, God shows up from time to time, especially when we are anxious or overwhelmed. Jesus appears more often than we realize, but we may not expect God to show up. Perhaps as we continue to walk by faith, we can still expect God to show up from time to time and be present.

Maybe we need to invite God into our lives; we may have to ask God to join us on our journey literally. This year, during Lent, the congregation received a challenge to draw near to Jesus through the ministry of prayer and goats. The congregation invited God to walk with us so we could experience walking with Jesus by our side during Lent and Easter. With Jesus by our side, we began to collect the prayers of our hearts and posted them on the cross. We also received offerings to provide goats for families with significant needs. During Lent and Easter, we seized the opportunity to have a life-changing connection with God through the ministry of prayer and the giving of resources, which is a fantastic demonstration of your faith.

Dear people, this year you have supported the Gospel of Jesus Christ not only in this town but in the world. Through the ministry of prayer and goats, and with Jesus by our side, the gifts of your hearts will benefit people here as well as those far away, all in the name of Jesus Christ.

THANK YOU SO MUCH!!

Hey Mount Olive, have you *HERD* the news?? We did it! We blew past our original goal of 10 goats and collected enough for a HERD of goats! That's right, we collected \$2112,

enough for *42 goats* from ELCA World Hunger!

Why goats? Goats can go where other animals can't, surviving in some of the world's most challenging terrain and



unreliable climates. Fresh milk from a goat provides daily nutrition for children and their families. What's more, goats are incredibly quick to reproduce, and they provide an opportunity for families to pass the gift on to others.





COUNCIL CORNER

Hello Mt. Olive:

Some years ago, when I watched the PBS documentary "The Plastics War," I was appalled and angered by what humans have

done to our earth, God's beautiful gift to us.

Have you ever seen plastic bags caught in fence lines and tall grass as you drive down the highway, or blowing across yards as you walk your dog?

The widespread use of soft plastic bags started in the U.S. in 1982 when Kroger and Safeway started using them. They are a great convenience but also a great detriment to our planet. Soft plastic is so lightweight that it can travel great distances. These bags have now been found in the depths of our oceans and at the summit of Mt. Everest. Disposing of soft plastic is a problem for everyone. Many countries have banned plastic bags, but that doesn't mean they are untouched by their effects on our planet.

"In 1993, the ELCA issued a statement pairing social justice and environmental justice in: Caring for creation: Vision, Hope, & Justice. In the Holy Scriptures, God assigns a sacred responsibility to human beings: we are to care for and keep God's creation for future generations." This statement makes me wonder. "But what can I do? How can I help? I am just a little old me."

Well, here at Mount Olive, we have an opportunity to help curb the soft plastic problem. The Trex Corporation uses soft plastic to make composite decking and outdoor furniture. As a project of the Green Space Team and with the blessing of the Church Council, we as a congregation will be collecting soft plastic. We will be collecting 1,000 pounds in one year. At the end of that year, we will receive a free park bench for our green space and prevent 1,000 pounds of plastic from going to a landfill.

As we get this project underway, you will hear a lot about it at Mount Olive. I know you will be shocked and amazed at how much plastic you will collect and not throw into the garbage.

We are very excited about this project; most of all, <u>everyone</u> can participate. All it takes is a conscious effort to look at your plastic before tossing it in the garbage.

Not only will we be training ourselves to learn soft plastic recycling, but we will be training our children and grandchildren as well.

Please join us as we commit to this project in caring for our common home, Mother Earth.

Free Pantry/ Kitchen Kupboard Food Pantry

Located in the lower level of Mount Olive, we are grateful for the Kitchen Kupboard Food Pantry and its ministry to our community's needy. The Pantry is open on select Thursday mornings or by appointment.

SERVICE TEAM UPDATE



Summer Collection Project

Once again, we will be collecting new and used <u>SHOES</u> for "Soles for Jesus".

Soles For Jesus exists to share God's love by distributing shoes to the underserved in sub-Saharan Africa. This valuable gift prevents disease and enables individuals to work safely and attend school.

What types of shoes does SFJ accept? All shoes! They accept new and used shoes of all types and sizes. Any unusable shoes will be repurposed, and every pair will be put to use.

What will be done with the received shoes that are not adequate for sending to Africa? Shoes that are not adequate in the African climate and terrain (i.e., winter boots or high heels) or are not usable due to excessive wear will be repurposed through micro-enterprises. Micro-enterprises represent one of the most effective ways to lift families out of extreme poverty in devastated economies. Small business owners can use our repurposed shoes to earn money for food and as a sustainable source of income.

Shoes may be brought in during the month of July and placed in the boxes in the Narthex. To help defray the cost of shipping shoes to Africa, we will place a collection jar near the boxes to accept donations of money. The challenge is to collect <u>\$1-\$2 per pair</u> of shoes donated. So go through your closets and bring in your shoes and a dollar.
