### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STEVE

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only Son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is the only Son, himself God, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

John 3:14-18 NRSV

#### The Word of God

We know that God's life-giving Word is embodied in the Bible, given for us to read, study, and carry in our hearts. One way Scripture speaks of "God's Word" is as *the things God has said*. The Bible is full of God's messages to humanity—words of hope, guidance, compassion, and encouragement. From the prophets who proclaimed God's promises, to the psalmists who poured out prayers, to the apostles who bore witness to Jesus, God's Word continues to speak to us today.

If someone were to hold up a Bible and ask, "What kind of story is this?" what could we say to capture its essence? Some might see it as history, others as poetry, or even as a collection of moral lessons. But my mentor, Pastor Tom Kent, often reminded me of something much deeper: the Bible is, above all, the story of God's love for humanity. From beginning to end, Scripture tells how God acts in the world to show us extravagant love. The Word does call us to accountability before God, but it also reveals God's mercy, grace, and kindness in ways that never end.

The Bible also teaches us that "the Word of God" is not only written on pages, but made flesh in Jesus Christ. The Gospel of John opens with these powerful words: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." In Jesus, the eternal Word took on human form, walked among us, and revealed God's heart in a way we could see and touch. Through Jesus' life, ministry, death, and resurrection, God's eternal compassion, mercy, and grace are made tangible and accessible to us.


This is why the Word of God is so central to our faith. Through Scripture, we learn Jesus' story. Through Jesus, we see the depth of God's love. And through that love we are invited into a new way of life—one shaped not by fear, but by faith; not by scarcity, but by abundance. When we open the Bible, we don't just find ancient words on a page—we encounter the living God who still speaks today.

So, I encourage you: spend time with the Word. Read it, pray it, and let it shape your heart. Whether you're reading a familiar psalm, following the story of the prophets, or listening again to Jesus' parables, trust that God will meet you there. In God's Word, we find life in Jesus' name. And that life is truly good news for us all.

### COUNCIL CORNER

"A righteous man cares for the needs of his animal." Proverbs 12:10

On October 5<sup>th</sup>, we will be having the "blessing of the animals" and celebrating the

Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Who was St. Francis? He grew up in Italy; his parents were very wealthy. He chose to become a priest and follow a life of poverty. He had a devotion to nature and animals. When you see a painting of St. Francis, he is usually seen with a bird perched on his shoulder. It is said he would practice his sermons by preaching to the birds! St. Francis is the patron saint of the vulnerable, the sick, the poor animals, and ecology. Did you know that St. Francis is credited with having the first "live nativity" celebration? This occurred in 1223 in Greccio, Italy. He felt it was a way to reflect the poverty of Christ's birth.

We can all recall our favorite pet. Whether it is a dog, cat, guinea pig, goat, or bird, we have loved them all. They seem to understand us and read our minds. They become a part of our family, totally dependent on us. As time goes on, we begin to anticipate each other's needs. Our dog seems to know just the right time when I need him to do nothing more than lie by me and rest his head on my feet.

I love watching documentaries on animals and am always in awe of God's hand in nature. Jane Goodall has spent a lifetime studying the emotions and family life of chimpanzees. All animals, not just our pets, can teach us so much. I have heard that horses are so in sync with us that their heartbeats will match a human's when standing within a certain radius of each other.

Dogs can be trained to sniff out everything from a drop in our blood sugar to a migraine, a seizure, and even certain types of cancer. In some studies, they were 88% accurate in detecting breast cancer and 99% accurate in detecting lung cancer.

Some people believe that animals have such strong senses and are intuitive because they can't speak.

In a time when so many voices are being heard and becoming amplified, we can sometimes miss all the sounds of the vulnerable. We can forget that some do not have a voice, and many times they are the most impacted. Sometimes those who say the least can teach us the most.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT & SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY

Wednesday Night Bible study meets at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesdays in the Fellowship Hall. Our first topic will be the completion of the study we began last year of the New Testament book of Romans, under the expert teaching leadership of Richard Grosenick. When that is completed, Richard will lead us in a study of the New Testament Book of Acts. That book's complete name is The Acts of the Apostles, and it is the account of the ministries of Peter and Paul in spreading the gospel. Acts was written by Luke as a continuation of his Gospel message. Richard cannot be with us in January, so we will then do a 5-week study of the short New Testament book of James, led by various members of the class who have already volunteered.

The Wednesday night class welcomes people with all levels of Biblical knowledge. You need not be a Bible "expert." Furthermore, 25% of the class are members of congregations other than Mount Olive, so feel free to invite your friends and neighbors to attend with you. For more information contact Dwight Cruikshank.

The Sunday adult education group meets from 9–9:50 a.m., between the worship services. This next educational year, we will be meeting in the Fellowship Hall (except when other activities are scheduled for that space) so that we can accommodate more people and so we can more easily have snacks or beverages.

The main topic for this coming year's study will be the New Testament book of Matthew. Matthew's focus is the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies through Jesus – to prove that Jesus is the Messiah. We won't get through the entire book this year, but join us as we discover, or re-discover, the Gospel of Matthew – the birth and early years of Jesus, the beginnings of his ministry, and his journeys with the disciples.

In additional to Matthew, we will also be doing some short studies during Advent and Lent. This year we will explore the Miracles and Heroes of the Bible. They both promise to be intriguing subjects, so don't miss out!


